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THE PRIVATE PILOTS LICENCE FOR HELICOPTERS

WHAT DOES PPL (H) MEAN?

The **P**rivate **P**ilot's **L**icence (H) is a qualification that allows you to fly a Helicopter for your own personal use. You may fly throughout the UK and Europe in reasonable weather, during the day. Places you can fly to, include airports, helipads and other suitable sites with the land owner's permission. Maybe even your own back garden!

WHAT CAN I USE IT FOR?

You may hire or buy a Helicopter and use it to fly for pleasure or business. You can take friends or family sightseeing and visit different areas of the country as well as fly abroad.

A PPL (H) is also ideal for business travel. You can beat the traffic jams and travel large distances quickly and economically. Perhaps you could land in the grounds of a hotel for your next meeting?

There are over 3000 listed places to land Helicopters in the UK including hotels, clubs and racecourses, not forgetting all the airports. Being the 21st century, there is even an app called 'Helipaddy' which lists most sites worldwide suitable for helicopter landings.

WHICH HELICOPTER WILL I FLY?

Helicopter tuition is carried out in the Robinson R22, Robinson R44 or Bell 206 JetRanger.

The Robinson R22 is a 2 seat, single engine, piston helicopter and with over 4000 machines produced and 30 years in the training market the R22 is one of the most popular training machines and certainly one of the most reliable.

The Robinson R44 is a 4-seat helicopter with the same control positions and instrument layout as the R22. It is a popular family helicopter which is fast and reliable. They are easy to operate anywhere in the world, in many different environments.

The Bell 206 is a 5 seat, single engine, turbine helicopter. Like the R22 & R44, the JetRanger is an extremely popular & reliable machine. Being a jet engine helicopter, the time acquired flying this type of helicopter will contribute greatly towards a Commercial Pilots experience and increase job prospects.



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WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE COURSE?

We include all pre and post flight briefings for the flying part of your training. Additional ground instruction is available if required. Unlike most schools, we also include all of the landing fees at Shobdon, fuel costs, as well as third party insurance during your training.

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE?

You may choose to book lessons on a daily, weekly or monthly basis. You can also block book days or weeks at a time. We can schedule the training to suit your own requirements. Some of our students learn at weekends or evenings to fit around their jobs, others take time out to train intensively in a short time period. If you choose to attend every day, five days a week, you should allow between four and six weeks to complete your course.

HOW TO GET STARTED?

Most people start with a trial lesson. They are a great way to get 'hands on' experience of flying a helicopter with a fully qualified Flight Instructor sat next to you! You will also have the opportunity to explore our world class training facility & chat to other instructors & students.

Our trial lesson includes a pre-flight briefing on basic helicopter procedures and aircraft controls, a pre-flight inspection as well as the start-up and shut down of the helicopter. In the air, you will be able to fly the helicopter yourself. Your instructor will introduce you to flying straight and level as well as how to turn, climb and descend. He will also introduce you to the art of hovering.

PRIVATE PILOT'S LICENCE (HELICOPTERS) COURSE SUMMARY

Flying Experience

The PPL (H) requires a minimum of 45 flying hours' experience in total, however it is not unusual to take longer, between 55 - 60 hours would be about the average. If you already hold a current PPL(A) you are entitled to a slight reduction to the minimum required.

The breakdown of hours is -

- 35 dual flying training hours (training with an instructor in the helicopter with you) 10 supervised solo flying training hours
- 45 flying hours is the minimum required, and the total will depend on you reaching the required standard to pass the PPL Skills Test.



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GROUND TRAINING AND EXAMINATIONS

At Tiger Helicopters, we will help guide you in your study towards the following CAA/EASA examinations which you will take here at Shobdon.

There are nine written exams which consist of multiple choice questions and one oral examination for the Radio License.

Aviation Law

This subject covers all the legal requirements for flying in the UK and Europe.

Operational Procedures

Air and safety procedures.

Helicopter Aircraft General Knowledge

Understanding the mechanics of the helicopter.

Principles of Flight

How and why does a helicopter fly.

Navigation & Radio Aids

The art of planning a route to arrive at your destination safely and on time.

Meteorology

This subject covers basic principles of weather and introduces you to all the information available for pre-flight planning

Human Performance and Limitations

Knowing your own physical limits and restrictions with relation to flying.

Flight Performance and Planning

The loading of the aircraft and its limitations relative to the conditions of the day.

Communications

Learn how to communicate with air traffic control and other services using the aircraft radio.

Flight Radiotelephony Operator's Licence Examination

An oral one-to-one test with a flight radio examiner.

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CAA MEDICAL EXAMINATION

The PPL (H) applicant must have a valid Class 2 Medical Certificate. We have a local Doctor who is an Aviation Medical Examiner and can issue the required Certificate. Please click the following link for further information. https://www.caa.co.uk/medical/

MINIMUM AGE

Experience gained from the age of 14 years can count towards your UK CAA PPL (H) application, however an applicant for the PPL(H) must be at least 17 years of age.

MAXIMUM WEIGHT

With the R22, the maximum pilot weight is 240lbs (17stone or 109Kg), The R44 has a maximum pilot weight of 280lbs (20 stone or 125kg) and the B206 doesn't have a specific limit.

WHAT CAN I DO WITH MY PPL (H)?

Becoming a helicopter pilot is a huge achievement, first & foremost, well done! Once qualified, pilots who have trained with Tiger Helicopters are able to hire our helicopters at any time.

Perhaps you could take your friends & family on a tour of the Welsh coast, or fly in for lunch at the Lake Vyrnwy Hotel? When possible, we can even arrange for you to have a helicopter overnight, so trips further afield may be considered.

We only charge for the amount of actual flying time and we offer discounts if hours are purchased in large quantities.

MAINTAIN YOUR LICENCE

Once you have obtained your PPL (H), it is important that you remain current. It is therefore a CAA/EASA requirement that you fly a minimum of 2 hours per year, as well as take an annual proficiency check, which you can do with our in-house examiner.

ADVANCED COURSES

The majority of your training will be carried out within about a 30 mile radius of Shobdon. We fully appreciate that once you achieve your PPL(H), you may want to broaden your flying horizons & keep challenging yourself! With this in mind, we offer additional, flexible, dual courses aimed at continually improving your skill and experience as a pilot, as well as taking in some stunning scenery and having lots of fun!



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Introduction to Mountain flying -

This 2-day course consists of 5 hours flying and all relevant ground schooling to teach you the basics of safe & enjoyable flying in and around mountainous areas. The course initially takes in the Black Mountains near Hay-on-Wye before moving onto the Welsh Mountains and Snowdonia with a refuel (and lunch!) stop at Caernarfon.

Advanced Navigation -

This 4-day course is designed to hone your skills in both planning and executing flights through controlled airspace, military airspace and finally, the London Heli Routes! The course consists of 10 hours flying and all relevant schooling & briefings to enable you to confidently fly through airspace you may previously have avoided and most excitingly, 2 flights through the London Heli Routes. Although challenging, flying the London Heli Routes will be one of the most rewarding flights you will ever fly & certainly one of the most scenic!

Foreign Flying -

Conquered the Heli Routes? How about another country...? We can create a bespoke course to teach foreign flights with schooling and briefings to cover issues such as long water crossings & crossing international boundaries. Flights to France can easily be arranged - Le Touquet being a popular airfield to fly to or perhaps Deauville if you are interested in a flight over the Normandy Beaches. Or you might elect to head west to the Isle of Man & Ireland.

Tiger Fly Outs -

If you're looking at something a little less formal, ask us about our school fly outs. Co-ordinated by one of our in-house instructors, a fly out can be a simple as 2 helicopters, a mixture of both students, instructors & private pilots and a trip to somewhere fairly local such as Duxford Airfield in Cambridgeshire for lunch! Or as complex as multiple aircraft on a 3-day round trip to France and back...!

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CAREER PACKAGES

YOUR CAREER IN HELICOPTER FLYING

Interested in becoming a professional helicopter pilot? This is made incredibly easy with Tiger Helicopters.

Having obtained your PPL (H), you must now acquire further experience in order to advance your career and become qualified to earn money as a Helicopter Pilot.

HOUR BUILDING

Your next step in gaining further experience is hour building. This is the term used in the industry to describe an approved and structured programme, which enables you to achieve the pre-entry requirements for the Commercial modular course. These are: -

- 155 hours' total time in helicopters of which
- 50 hours must be pilot in command and
- 10 hours' cross country flying (Aeroplane licence holders are entitled to a reduction in these hours)

During your hour building you will increase your skills as a helicopter pilot. You will undertake many flights around the country, experiencing flight in controlled and military airspace. You will also practice and perfect normal manoeuvres.

As part of your pre-entry requirements you must have passed the commercial ground exams. We would strongly recommend that you study for these exams alongside your hour building & we can advise you on which school to study with.

MODULAR CPL (H) COURSE CONTENT

The commercial course requirements are 35 hours, 30 hours of which are dual flight training with an instructor and a further 5 hours of night flying instruction.

You will also need to pass 13 written exams in the following subjects: -

Air Law,
Aircraft General Knowledge - Airframe/Systems/Power plant,
Aircraft General Knowledge – Instrumentation,
Mass and Balance,
Performance,
Flight Planning and Monitoring,
Human Performance,
Meteorology,



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General Navigation,
Radio Navigation,
Operational Procedures,
Principles of Flight,
Visual Flight Rules (VFR) Communications

FLYING INSTRUCTOR COURSE

After acquiring 220 hours' total time, of which at least 100 are pilot in command, you may commence a Flying Instructor Course. The course covers all aspects of helicopter flying and teaching techniques. You will learn how to prepare and present briefings, how to conduct each flight exercise and to perfect flying from the left-hand seat. The course consists of 125 hours of ground instruction and 30 hours of dual flight training. At the end of the course a CAA/EASA Panel Examiner will assess you.

A pass will mean you can now enjoy what many have found to be a satisfying and rewarding career teaching others to fly helicopters.

ADVANCED TRAINING COURSES

TYPE RATINGS (To add additional Helicopter types onto a License)

The Single Engine Type Rating Course consists of a minimum of 8 hours of Ground instruction, 5 hours of Flight instruction on the specific Helicopter Type, and then a Skills Test with an examiner.

COMMERCIAL MODULAR COURSE

The Commercial Modular Course consists of a minimum of 30 hours of Flight instruction and 5 hours of Night Flight instruction (35 hours total)

FLIGHT INSTRUCTOR COURSE

The Flight Instructor Course consists of a minimum of 30 hours of Flight instruction and 125 hours of Ground instruction.

The current advanced payment rate for the Commercial and Flight Instructor Courses using the R22 is £375.00 per hour (plus vat). Prices for courses conducted on other aircraft types are available on request.


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
